Minister Fortier,

With the growing concern of the Omicron COVID-19 variant, we are writing you to ask that you provide strong leadership and consistent, centralized guidance to government departments and deputy heads around the following:

1. Telework; and
2. Essential and critical employees without access to a third booster shot.


To reduce confusion and protect employees, it is more important than ever that departments have a clear decision from the Office of the Chief Human Resources Officer about how to conduct and manage telework during the pandemic. We have seen inconsistencies across departments about how telework should be applied due to Treasury Board's vague guidelines and lack of direction.

Our position is clear and consistent with your prior position: if public service employees have the option to telework, they should telework whenever possible. This will ensure that employees can stay safe and abide by public health directives, all while continuing to maintain the high and uninterrupted level of service they have been delivering throughout the pandemic.

For essential and critical employees who cannot get their third dose in their respective provinces, these employees should have access to their shot through the federal government in the absence of access to rapid testing. With the rising threat of Omicron, employees should not have to fear for their safety in the workplace, particularly with an employer as reputable and upstanding as the Government of Canada.

While we understand this is a difficult time and constantly adapting to ever-changing public health guidelines is a challenge, rather than dispatching responsibility and leaving flexible guidelines open to interpretation, we urge you, Minister, to be a leader for departments and issue a clear, centralized message to deputy heads informing them that these policies should be utilized whenever possible.
